A Message from our Founder

From the outset, GGWW has worked for survivors and to clearly, specifically, and adamantly require an end to misogyny, violence, and inequity. 2025 began with additional challenges and an increase in attacks and harassment of girls and women, online and in person. GGWW has met this with its usual vigor.

In order to better serve our website visitors and ensure that our domain name is manageable, we secured a new domain: ggwwrights.org GGWW will have a highly visible campaign throughout 2026 in transition to our new domain.



In the summer of 2025 GGWW developed a groundbreaking tool for sexual assault survivors. We have collected data and mapped many of the SAFE/SANE sites and providers across the US and will launch the map on our website in early 2026.

Innovation as Activism

Sexual assault survivors need forensic care. SAFE (Sexual Assault Forensic Examiners) and SANE (Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners) staff are specifically trained providers. Many hospitals do not have trained personnel and send survivors to other facilities that may be a considerable distance, at a time when they need immediate care. GGWW has created a resource, never before available, to assist survivors in locating the care they need.

Pioneering

In Person Engagement

GGWW presented a day long symposium to mark Start By Believing Day and April as Sexual Assault Awareness Month (SAAM) with multiple workshops that engaged students in discussion and set future expectations. Bergen Community College was our host and partner. Students, both young women and men and with varied areas of academic interests participated with thoughtful discourse.
